Resident Reminders

Service Request: To place a service request for your apartment please call the office at 773.924.2100. You can also set up an account online to put in the service request on your own.

Also, as a reminder, Maintenance will install lightbulbs free of charge, however, resident are responsible for paying for lightbulbs in their home. If you need to add the cost to your rental account, please inform us when you call in your service request.

Lease Renewal: As a reminder residents are required to sign a new lease

agreement annually. Residents are notified 120 days prior to their annual lease signing.

Here are a few tips to help the process:

- 1. Be sure to sign and date all the forms in the Recertification package sent to you.
- 2. Be sure to turn in up-to-date information
- 3. If you receive SSI/Social Security you are required to print out from Social Security Administration. Print out must have current date on it.
- 4. If you receive a pension, you are required to get a PRINTOUT from your pension that has a current date on it.
- 5. You will need to turn in six current months of checking account statements.
- 6. You will need to turn in one current month of your saving account statement.
- 7. If you have direct express, you will need an ATM print out to show your current balance.
- 8. If your income increases or decreases you are required to report it.
- 9. All lease agreements are not the same. Please refer to YOUR lease for reference.
